What is Supported Housing?

- You choose what supports you want
- The housing is long-term
- You can receive help with obtaining a subsidy or affordable rent
- Supports adjust to your decreasing or increasing needs and crisis services remain available at all times

Studies show that:

- Supported Housing improves consumers' quality of life
- Supported Housing can help people retain their housing about 80% of the time
- When people are in Supported Housing the likelihood of rehospitalization is reduced
- Housing stability decreases the need for treatment
